Down Syndrome Legislation in Pennsylvania

The PA House passed the Down Syndrome Protection Act in April, and it will now come to a vote in the PA Senate. We urge you to contact your PA Senator and ask him to support Senate Bill 1050. (Check *butlerphl.com* if you are unsure who your State Senator is.)

This bill will prohibit abortions which are performed solely on the basis that the unborn child has been diagnosed with down syndrome; currently in PA these babies can be aborted up to 24 weeks gestation.

Challenging Roe v. Wade

In 2013, Arkansas and North Dakota passed heartbeat legislation prohibiting abortion early in the first trimester. Heartbeat bills attempt to ban abortions after a heartbeat can be detected, which is often as early as six weeks' gestation. These bills were both challenged in court and blocked. In 2015, the Eighth Court of Appeals affirmed the lower court rulings in both cases. The US Supreme Court declined to be involved, effectively keeping the block in place.

So far this year, states have been busy passing abortion legislation, most of it aimed at restricting the procedure. Ohio is among the handful of states passing heartbeat bills in 2019, though all have been challenged. Under the precedent established by Roe v. Wade and Planned Parenthood v. Casey, legislation that protects life often before the mother knows she is pregnant is deemed to place an "undue burden on a woman's right to choose."

Alabama has stepped forward with the boldest bill yet, banning abortion in all cases except to save the life of the mother. This legislation has likewise been blocked, again citing the precedent established in Roe v. Wade.

All that changes if Roe v. Wade is reversed. With the recent confirmations of Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh to the U.S. Supreme Court, there may be the votes necessary to finally do away with this horrible decision.

In fact, the authors of these recent pro-life laws readily admit they are intended to have the Supreme Court reconsider Roe v. Wade. Governor Mike DeWine of Ohio said of his state's heartbeat bill, "Roe is an outdated, terribly decided precedent and it's time that the Supreme Court take a second look at it. We're confident that the Heartbeat Bill could be the legislation that reaches that level."

Alabama Governor Kay Ivey had a similar viewpoint regarding her state's law: "The sponsors of this bill believe that it is time, once again, for the U.S. Supreme Court to revisit this important matter, and they believe this act may bring about the best opportunity for this to occur."

After all these years, Roe v. Wade may finally get another look. It's hard to imagine, with the volume of pro-life bills being passed and then blocked by lower courts, that the high court won't rule on the matter.

Millennials are Pro-Life — They Just Need the Facts

According to a poll by Students for Life of America, 70% of millennials supported some restrictions on abortion. Only 7% agreed that abortion should be allowed without exception and funded with tax dollars.

Also interesting is their view of Planned Parenthood. Initially, 54% of millennials had a favorable view of this organization. However, upon being informed that Planned Parenthood performs more than 300,000 abortions a year, this support fell to 41%. It dropped further to 35% when millennials learned that Planned Parenthood registered profits approaching \$100 million and spent \$30 million during the 2016 election cycle.

The younger set, like the rest of the nation, is pro-life at heart.

Chemical Abortions and Telemed

The use of mifepristone, or RU486, to cause abortions has been increasing in the last decade; these "chemical" abortions now make up 40% or so of all abortions.

A new twist to using this drug is the development of Telemed or webcam abortions. Due to the shortage of abortionists, abortion facilities developed a protocol which makes it unnecessary to have the abortionist present in the room with the pregnant woman. The abortionist simply authorizes the prescription and distribution of the abortion pill via online video communication. This lack of any in-person examination of the pregnant woman by a physician exposes women to increased risks from the abortion; the women simply speak with the physician over a webcam.

The concerns of pro-lifers and public health professionals about the safety of Telemed abortions are well founded. Nineteen states have banned the use of Telemed abortions and in March of 2019 the Food and Drug Administration issued warning letters to two abortion groups that are selling abortion drugs to American women over the Internet.

Thanks to President Trump

On June 5, 2019, the Trump administration announced that the US Department of Health and Human Services will not renew a fetal tissue contract with the University of California. The decision concludes a review of research using tissue from aborted fetuses. Health and Human Services state they have committed \$20 million for research "to develop, demonstrate and validate" alternative experimental models, which do not use aborted fetal tissue.

Trump's Pro-Life Record

President Trump's time in office has been marked by a myriad of pro-life successes. He ran for president as a pro-lifer and he has not disappointed on that score. In particular, his nomination of two justices to the Supreme Court could prove to be the most consequential pro-life action in decades if the Court ends up hearing a challenge to Roe v. Wade and reversing that awful decision.

In only 2 1/2 years, President Trump's list of pro-life accomplishments includes:

- Nominated and saw confirmed two strict constructionists, Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh, to the US Supreme Court, critical moves that may ultimately usher in the reversal of Roe v. Wade.
- Filled 150+ other judicial vacancies, including 37 Circuit Court judges, 41 US Court of Appeals judges, and 80 District Court judges. Rounding out the lower levels of the judicial branch with pro-lifers is a huge win.
- Permitted states to defund Planned Parenthood of Title X funds.
- Stopped tax dollars from funding abortion overseas and defunded the pro-abortion UN-FPA.
- Required health plans to disclose if they cover abortion.
- Appointed pro-lifers to key positions in his administration.
- Strengthened the enforcement of federal laws protecting the conscience rights of health care workers who do not want to participate in abortion.
- Allowed states to defund Planned Parenthood of Medicaid funds.
- Canceled huge contract for taxpayer-funded experimentation with body parts of aborted babies.
